



Community Property Tree Selection List, solutions for a tight and arid community

PALO BLANCO

white bark acacia

Small deciduous tree 10' to 20'. Reflected sun to partial shade. Cold hardy 25° to 30° F.

Excellent for planting close to structures. Slow growing.



BOTTLEBRUSH

A small evergreen tree, 6-15'. Tolerates full sun. Medium growth rate with long bloom season. Withstands light frost or short cold spells down to 32°.

Variety includes: Weeping foliage, Crimson and Lemon flowers.



DESERT WILLOW

not a true willow

Small deciduous tree under 15' that tolerates full sun.

Blooms in April thru September with pink fragrant flowers. Foliage color is green.



KIDNEYWOOD

Arizona native, semi-deciduous. Tolerant of sun, reflected heat, drought, poor soils, and cold. Cold hardy 15° to 30° F.

A small tree with an open canopy, vanilla scented flowers and small, one seeded pods. Great around pools and in narrow areas.

Buffelgrass and Tucson National Club Property:

Many residents are mistaking the native grass **Purple threeawn** for Buffelgrass. **Purple threeawn** (*Aristida purpurea*) is a common perennial in **Arizona** and is used as an erosion control plant around the golf course. At this time Buffelgrass is under control on club property....the maintenance crew removes the invasive grass at first notice.
