Trees are selected for their drought tolerance, heat resistance, cold hardiness, and landscape esthetics. A couple are low production of airborne pollen are listed as well.

NOTE: To avoid airborne pollen select plants that are pollinated by creatures rather than by the wind. Brightly colored flowers are usually pollinated by creatures.



CRIMSON BOTTLEBRUSH

Callistemon citrinus

Small evergreen tree. Low to mild allergen.

Size: 6' to 15' with similar spread.


Flowers: Bright crimson with long bloom season. Water Needs: Moist to dry soil. Drought tolerant.

Comments: Medium growth rate. The leaves can be used to make a tea and the

blossoms can be used to sweeten the tea.

Withstands light frost or short cold spells down to 32° F.

Variety includes: Weeping foliage, Crimson, and Lemmon.



DESERT FERN

Lysiloma thornberi

Evergreen to deciduous tree.

Size: 12-15' tall, 12' spread.

Flowers: flowers are little puff balls that ornament the tree during Spring and

Summer.

Water Needs: Moist to dry soil. Drought tolerant.

Comments: Fast growth rate with water. Shade capacity rated as low in leaf.

Hardy to 20° F. Full Sun



DESERT WILLOW, Sweet Desert Willow

Chilopsis linearis

Deciduous shrub or small tree. Low production of airborne pollen.


Size: 30' tall with 27' spread.

Flowers: Fragrant, pink to lavender from May to late September or frost.

Water Needs: Moist to dry soil. Drought tolerant.

Comments: Fast growth rate. Heat resistant. Moderate to little water.

Hardy to 10°F.



HOPSEED BUSH

Dodonaea viscosa

Small evergreen tree or hedge bush.

Size: 20' tall with equal spread. Fast growth rate.

Flowers: Inconspicuous flowers in summer are long lasting.

Water Needs: Moist to dry. Drought tolerant.

Comments: Smog resistant. Full sun to partial shade.

Hardy to 15°F.

Variety: Purple Hopseed



JAPANESE PISTACHE, Mastic Tree

Pistacia lentiscus

Larger irregular evergreen shrub or small tree of the Pistacio genus. Produces a sweet liguorice-flavored aromatic chewable resin, called 'mastic'. Helpful with mouth bacteria.

Size: 15-25' tall with equal or greater spread. Flowers: dioecious; inconspicuous, in axils of leafs.

Fruit: rarely present, red to black berries.

Water Needs:Little to no water. Comments: Full sun to part shade.

Hardy to 20°F.

Hardiness: to high teens, damaged in mid teens.



MULGA ACACIA

Acacia aneura

Evergreen tree. Wood has allergen and toxic properties.

Size:v14' to 18' with 15'-18' spread. Fast growth rate. Full sun.

Flowers: Blooms small, sulphur yellow, rod shaped flowers. Trees may produce 3 to

4 flower cycles per year.

Water Needs: Moist to dry soil

Hardy to 15°F.



PALO BLANCO
White -barked acacia

Small deciduous tree. Accent tree in landscaping. Excellent for planting close to structures.

Size: 10' to 20' tall with equal spread. Water Needs: Drought tolerant.

Comments: Reflected sun to partial shade. Slow growing.

Cold hardy 25° to 30° F.



TEXAS EBONY

Ebenopsis ebano

Small evergreen tree, semi deciduous. Produces a dense canopy. Has thorny branches.

Size: 30' tall and 30' wide.

Flowers late spring to fall followed by large seedpods.

Fruit: Persistent, brown or black edible.

Water Needs: Well drained soil. Little or no water.

Comments: Slow growth rate. Heat tolerant.

Hardy to 10°F.



TEXAS MOUNTAIN LAUREL

Sophora secundiflora

Small evergreen tree. Low production of airborne pollen.

Size: 15-25' tall with 10-12' spread.

Flowers: Blooms in the spring clusters of purple/blue fragrant flowers.

Water Needs: Moist to dry.

Comments: Slow growth. Allergenic. Poisonous.

Hardy to 20° F.
